### Tip #1: Academic Planning Prevents Academic Recovery





### FAMILY EDUCATION RIGHTS & PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

College students, regardless of age, are the "legal entity" of their record.

As the legal authority, students are the primary source of information (i.e. grades, GPA, class attendance, eligibility for graduation).



#### Belmont Email



- University's primary and official source of the communication with students. (@bruins.belmont.edu)
- Student should check email EVERY DAY.

### **Belmont Alerts**




- Student email is automatically enrolled






# Important Authoritative/Learned Optimism Statement Examples
